With direction from the Clinical Director, our Clinician's will be instrumental in the implementation of program activities, therapeutic treatment, case management, and intervention for the Journey Home Project. The individual must have experience working with youth and families, specifically related to substance use disorders. Additional experience working with the homeless and/or precariously housed individuals is highly preferred. Some public speaking experience is beneficial. Master's degree in social work from an accredited institution with at least one year of experience preferred. The applicant must be licensed as an LMSW working toward clinical licensure. Primary Responsibilities:

- Conducts intake interviews, obtains data and develops diagnosis and treatment plans.
- Facilitates counseling and psycho-educational groups, provides individual and family therapy sessions.
- Prepares progress notes and other clinical records on client progress and documents other, client-related contacts in timely manner. Prepares reports outside agencies, including judicial agencies and may testify in court when needed.
- Provides crisis intervention services.
- Consults with representatives of other agencies or programs and provides and coordinates client case management services.
- Makes professional and educational presentations to agency, staff and the public.
- Performs other related duties and responsibilities as required.

Qualifications/Skills & Knowledge Requirements

Education: Master's Degree in Social Work from an accredited institution.

Experience: At least 1 year of experience directly related to the duties and responsibilities specified. Applicant must be an LMSW working toward clinical licensure.
